Market Beef Weigh-In

If you plan to sell a market steer, market heifer or a Second Year Bucket Calf at the 2018 Hodgeman County Fair, you must attend the following:

Market Beef Weigh-In Saturday, March 10, 2018 10:00 a.m. - 11:30 am Shriwise Feedlot - Jetmore



Photographs will NOT be accepted. All entries must be weighed and tagged by March 10, 2018.

Arrangements may be made for weigh-in prior to Fri. March 9th, but no calves will be weighed after Sat. March 10th. Second Year Bucket Calves must have been exhibited by the same 4-Her at the 2017 Hodgeman Co. Fair. Second Year calves and other market beef must meet minimum sale weight of 1,000 pounds, to be eligible for the sale.

Tagging - Due to an increased cost, each 4-Her is allowed the following FREE ear tags:

2 FREE tags per 4-Her, per specie. Additional tags will be sold at a cost for the following: Market Beef - \$3 each additional tag, payable to 4-H Council, due at weigh-in.

If you plan to exhibit a market animal at the Kansas State Fair or the Kansas Jr. Livestock Show, you MUST use electronic ear tags and complete the nomination process of DNA collection. EID tags & DNA Envelopes available at the Extension Office.

Mandatory Small Animal Weigh-In Hog / Lamb & Meat Goat Wednesday, May 16, 2018 Evening session - 6:00 - 8:00 p.m.

- All 4-Hers selling livestock at the county fair must attend Mandatory Livestock Quality Assurance (LQA) on Wednesday, May 16th, 7:15 p.m. 4-H Building, Jetmore.
- Market Lambs must attend a weigh-in and meet scrapie tag requirements, attend LQA on May 16th.
- Market Goats must attend a weigh-in and meet scrapie tag requirements, attend LQA on May 16th.
- Market Hogs must attend a weigh-in & Livestock Quality Assurance on Wed. May 16th
- Market Beef exhibitors must also attend the Livestock Quality Assurance on Wed. May 16th

Tagging - Due to an increased cost, each 4-Her is allowed the following FREE ear tags:

2 FREE tags per 4-Her, per specie.

Additional tags will be sold at a cost for the following: Steers - \$3 each additional tag Small animals - \$3 each additional tag. Payment to 4-H Council, is due at weigh-in for the additional tags.

EID tags must be used for KSF & KJLA market animals.

In 2018 all animal nominations require 3 parts:

1. DNA Envelope - with exhibitor & parent signature.

(available from the Extension Office).

2. Nomination Declaration Form.

3. \$8 per head fee.

Guidelines For 4-H Club Day

- All persons must be enrolled in 4-H for the 2017-2018 year by an online enrollment & participation form before they may participate in County 4-H Club Day. See this newsletter for 4-H Day Event Guidelines.
- Inform your Community 4-H Club Leader by February 8th with your Club Day entries. It is the responsibility of the 4-Her to inform the leader.
- Age is determined by the age of the 4-H member on Jan. 1st of the current year.

Sr. Division - 12 years and older. Jr. Division - 11 years or younger

Age of the oldest participant in a group will determine if the group entry is a Jr. or Sr. category. **Example:** If one youth is age 12 or older, and the rest are age 11 or younger, the group will compete in the Sr. Division.

Remember: 4-Hers do not need to be from the same 4-H Club to perform as duets or groups.

- All entries will receive a blue, red or white ribbon.
- Entries earning top blue placing at the county level are eligible to compete at Regional Club Day.
- You may participate in any of the events listed in this newsletter.
- In addition to a blue ribbon, top blue winners will receive a dollar coin, compliments of 4-H Council.
- The Top Blue Model Meeting 4-H Club will receive a trophy.
- Pizza will be served to County 4-H Day families, compliments of 4-H Foundation.



Sr. Division – 14 and older Jr. Division – 13 and younger (unless otherwise stated in individual sections) AGE of the oldest participant in a group will determine if the group entry is a Jr. or Sr. group. Example: If one youth is 14 or older and the rest are 13 and younger the group will compete in the Sr. group.

All entries will receive a Top Blue/Purple, blue, red or white ribbon rating.

It is the option of the agents or judges to change entries from one section to another section which they deem as more appropriate based on the major theme or intent of the entry.
